Who should attend the workshops?

The workshops are designed for registered veterinarians working in large or mixed animal practice in regional or peri-urban Western Australia. Preference for the practical post-mortem workshop will be given to vets servicing the northern beef industry and new graduates in rural practice.

Course content: Livestock disease investigation & EAD workshop

Day 1 topics include:

- What is your role in the next EAD
- Where will it come from
- Safe secure sample packaging made simple
- Funding and support schemes through DPIRD
- Welfare obligations for fit to load certificates

Day 2 topics include:

- Making disease investigations easier restraint, euthanasia, knife sharpening
- How to clinically differentiate endemic from exotic diseases
- Samples from the long dead
